Bid Amendment 2

All other bid components from the original bid package remain unchanged.

Questions and Answers from Pre-Construction Bid Tour

Q: *Regarding Prevailing Wages and Labor Compliance. PWA informed bidders that no certified weekly payroll records were required nor labor compliance paperwork.*

A: However, based on further review of our funder's contracts...DIR may require that Contractors prove prevailing wage rates (show payroll records) and/or request an onsite meeting. Therefore, we will require that the successful bidder comply with all State of California Department of Industrial Relations Labor Codes (Specifically Sections 16450-16455; 1771, and 1773.

The successful contractor must keep accurate payroll records, showing the name, address, social security number, work classification, straight time and overtime hours worked each day and week, and the actual per diem wages paid to each journeyman, apprentice, worker, or other employee employed by him or her in connection with the public work. Only *certified payroll records* will be required at the request of DIR.

In addition, SB854 (effective June 20, 2014) made several changes to the laws governing how the DIR monitors compliance with prevailing wage requirements on public works projects. By April 1, 2015: No contractor or subcontractor may work on a public works project unless registered. Therefore, the awarded contractor must register and pay an annual fee to DIR prior to Season 2 construction. Registration can be done online at <https://efiling.dir.ca.gov/PWCR/ActionServlet?action=displayPWCRegistrationForm>. In addition, the Labor Commissioner may at any time require the contractors and subcontractors to furnish electronic certified payroll records. Therefore, we will require that the contractor complete those in case DIR makes a request. Finally, if DIR requests any onsite meetings, the Contractor will be reimbursed for that time.

Q: *Regarding Prevailing Wages, can crews work (4) 10 hour days, or must the crews work a (5) 8 hour schedule?*

A: Since this project is funded by State funds, any work exceeding 8 hours a day or 40 hours a week **MUST** be paid at overtime wage rates.

Q: *Will lodging be provided? If so, what are the amenities and will it be available for both Season 1 and Season 2 work?*

A: We are waiting for official word from Camp SLO regarding this matter, we will release a statement as soon as we have details confirmed.

Q: *Regarding Invoicing and Payment, when can contractors expect to get paid for services, i.e. what is the turnaround time from invoice to payment?*

A: As noted on Table E1: The invoicing and payment process is in arrears and may be more than 90 days after submittal of an approved invoice. However, the portion of 2014 construction funded by the CSLRCD will be paid within 30 days if submitted before the 5th of the month and within 60 days if submitted after the 5th of the month. Since, PWA will be subcontracting construction, we will work with the selected Contractor if MBNEP payment will be significantly delayed due to reimbursement from SWB and the Contractor is in a bind.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• This is an equipment rental contract requiring operators paid at prevailing wage rates. The method of payment will be HOURLY based on engine running time. Equipment will only be paid for actual equipment operation.• Additional equipment or materials not specified by bid items (Table E4) shall be negotiated with the successful contractor.• Mobilization and demobilization shall be included with bid items for the equipment specified in the Bid Schedule.• Additional equipment ordered shall be negotiated with the successful contractor.• Contractor shall possess a Class "A" ,"C12" or "C61" license or California Licensed Timber Operator License at the time this contract is bid or a combination of classes required by the categories and type of work included in this contract.• All culvert, rock, and seed/straw materials will be purchased by PWA and delivered to locations noted during the bid tour. Contractor is responsible to mobilize culverts and rock to individual sites, as per the road logs (Appendix B).• The successful contractor will work under the direct supervision of PWA and all tasks listed in the road logs (Appendix B) must be completed to our satisfaction.• The estimated heavy equipment and labor costs to complete the project are \$230,000.

2	Bulldozer	The CONTRACTOR shall be paid an hourly rate to provide a bulldozer tractor with 6-way blade, minimum 18” multi-shank ripper attachment, and operator (Caterpillar D-4 or 5, or equivalent). The hourly rate shall include operator (paid at prevailing wages), tractor and all incidentals required for tractor operation. Only hours of operation will be payable.
3	5 yd ³ Dump Truck 10 yd ³ Dump Truck	The CONTRACTOR shall be paid an hourly rate to provide five or ten-cubic yard dump trucks with operators. 8	Labor	The CONTRACTOR will be paid the cost of labor for the workers (paid at prevailing wages) used in the actual and direct performance of the WORK independent of that work associated with equipment operations. Only hours of actual labor will be payable.
